AFS WORKSHOPS



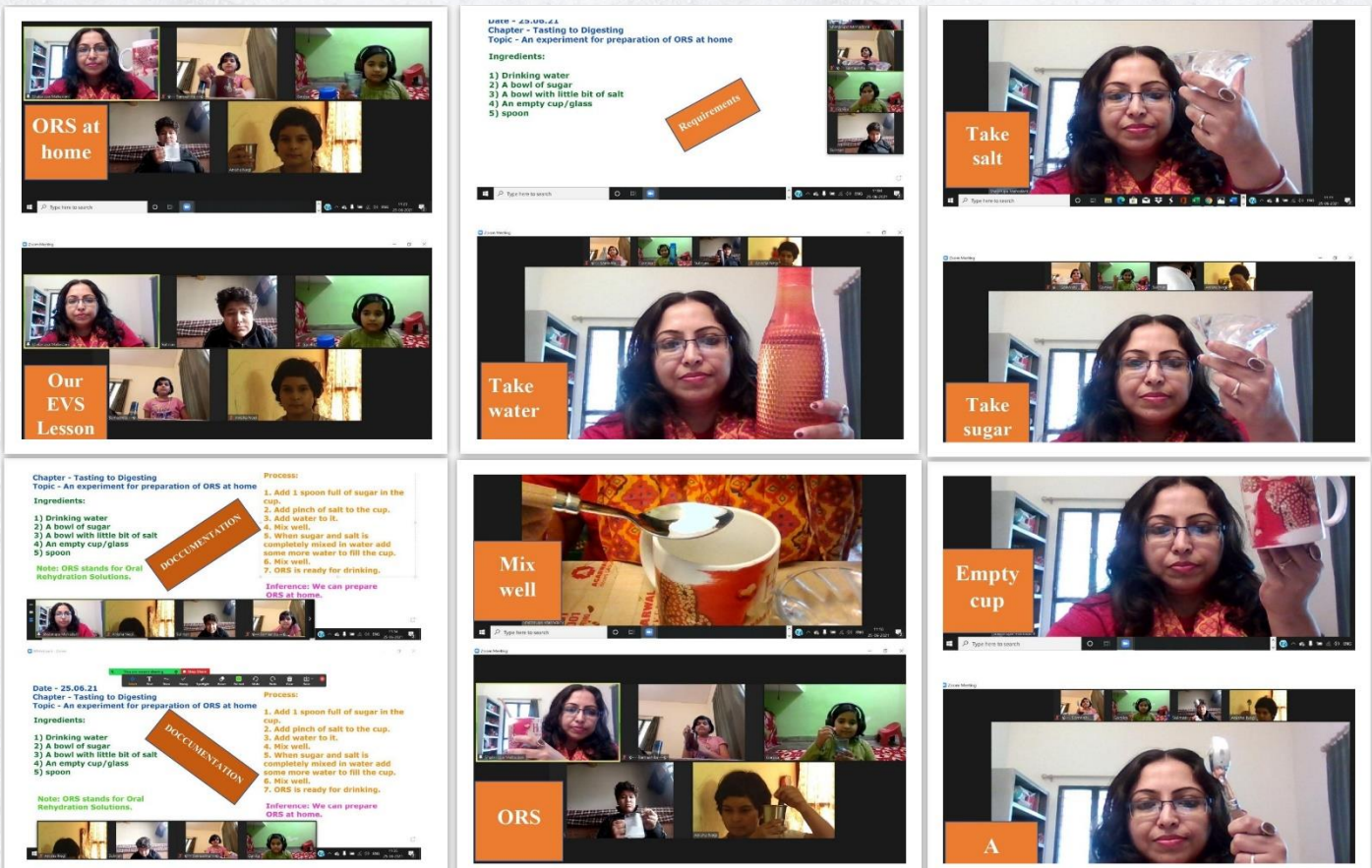

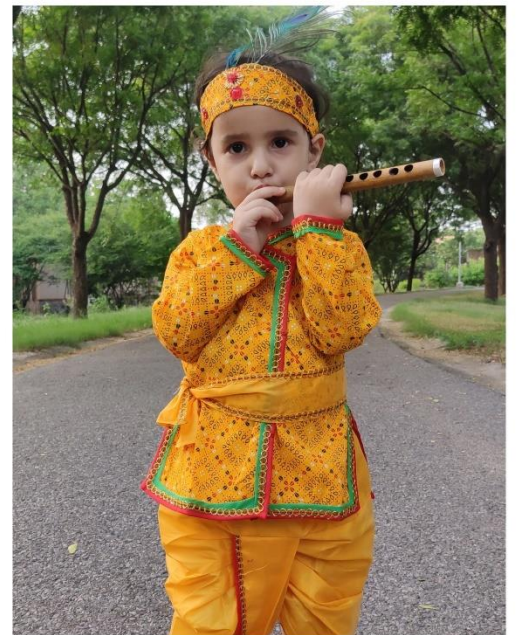
